Please feel free to say hello and introduce yourself to Lisa at the start or end of the school day – she's looking forward to meeting as many of you as possible!

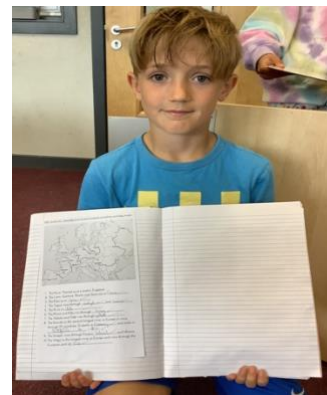
We are especially looking forward to our **upcoming Sports Days**, and we are pleased to share the confirmed dates with you:

In **Year 1** this week they started their Celebration topic with a class 'Birthday Party' where they spoke about the celebration and what birthdays mean to them.

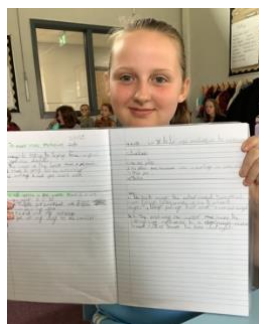
**Year 2** have been looking at structures and started their topic by using different objects to build towers.

### Considerate Communication

At Redfield Educate Together we believe it's important to work in partnership with parents and carers to create a safe and respectful environment for everyone.

It has been brought to our attention that recently some conversations have taken place between parents (face to face and via social media) which have made some of our school community feel uncomfortable. We have been informed that some conversations have named individual children and have also referred to some children as being “bad children”, “badly behaved children”, or “bullies”.

We aim to be an open school who listen objectively and respond honestly to all parents. We work hard to resolve issues in school and keep the wellbeing of all our children at the centre of all we do. Please think about how your comments could come across, and about how you would feel if you were on the receiving end. Consider if there is a better way to respond to the situation.
