Reception Class there has been building, and role play as well as exploring outside, playing with sand and water and climbing. They are beginning to form new friendships, learning how to play together sharing toys and following the Redfield Way.

Year 1 have been colour mixing and looking at how they can make secondary colours from primary colours. Whilst in Year 2 they have been looking at colours that compliment each other and contrast by using a colour wheel.

In Year 3 they have been working together to complete tasks in their computing lessons to recognise how digital devices can change the way that we work Year 4 have been developing their shading skills in their art work focusing upon Anglo Saxon treasures.

Our Year 5s have been working with GREENGAGE Project. They have contributed their views on the local neighbourhood by using technology to identify points of interest around the school and identify the positives and negatives of the surrounding streets.

Year 6 have been looking at Historic land use from the 1700s. They found the change from communal farming to modern private ownership and how trade plays a huge part in this.










How to apply for a new year 7 secondary school place.

If your child is in year 6 or was born between 1 September 2014 and 31 August 2015 you need to apply for a new year 7 secondary place. Apply online from **Friday 12 September 2025** for September 2026 admissions. You'll need to register for an account on the Bristol City Council Parent Portal admissions system if you've not made an online application for a school place or free school meals before. The final date and date and time for making limited changes to an existing application for the first round of allocations is midnight on **4 November 2025**.
