### **Class Expectations**

- We are continuing to practice our Redfield Way this year, and will always aim to be kind, safe and ready.
- Show and tell will take place every Thursday.
- Please do not bring in toys or stationery from home as we have everything the children need and it can also be upsetting if special possessions are lost or broken.

### PE

Our PE days are Tuesday and Thursday. Please ensure children come to school on those days wearing suitable clothing and footwear (trainers, t-shirt, leggings, joggers or shorts).

### Spelling

- Spelling tests will usually take place on a Friday. Spellings can be accessed on our class page on the school website and on SeeSaw.
- Each week's list of words will be linked to a particular spelling pattern, phonic sounds and statutory Year 2 spellings.

## Reading

- Reading at home can have a huge impact on children's progress, as well as encouraging them to read for pleasure.
- All children will bring reading books home from school, and they may have books of their own choice from home or the public library that they choose to read.
- Children should read to an adult at least 5 times a week for 10 minutes.
- If your child mainly reads on their own, it is helpful to talk to them about what they're reading and ask them to summarise what they have read so far.
- Please record in your child's reading record when they have read. This can simply be a signature.

### **Further home learning**

Read every day with your child and write down book title, page number and comment in **reading record**.
